Planning for your Glucose Tolerance Test:

- Walk-in only; no need to schedule
- Begin test between 7 and 9 a.m.
- Any Horizon Draw site can perform this test.
- Drink only water and do not eat for 8-10 hours before the test. Gestational Screen patients do not have any restrictions.
- For your safety, we ask that you stay at the lab for the full test.
 - 1-2 hours for Gestational Diabetes Screen
 - o 3-4 hours for a 2 or 3-hour Glucose Tolerance Test
- Limit your movements during the test.
- Blood will be collected at each hour.

What is this test?

An oral glucose tolerance test (OGTT) checks for diabetes or prediabetes. To start the test, the lab draws your blood to check your blood sugar (glucose) level. Then you will drink a liquid with a lot of sugar. The lab draws blood every hour for the next 2 to 3 hours. The answers to these test results will help your doctor identify diabetes.

Why do I need this test?

The test is a first step in detecting prediabetes, diabetes, or gestational diabetes.

You may need this test if you have symptoms or risks for diabetes. Overweight adults ages 40 to 70 should have their blood glucose checked every 3 years. All adults should be tested for diabetes every 3 years starting at age 45. Adults with diabetes should have their blood tested more often.
